Pastoral Thoughts from The Rev. Dr. Ketlen Solak

Filled with New Wine?

"...in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." (Acts 2:11- 13 NRSV)

The celebration of the Day of Pentecost was particularly special this year. Our three BCM congregations worshiped together as one, Bishop Kevin Brown officiated at both services, eleven adults and youth confirmed or reaffirmed their Christian faith anew, and the youngest member of Grace and BCM was baptized. In addition, we posed for a group photo, and, on account of God's generosity, we were able to enjoy the delicious fare of a relatively rainfree outdoor picnic. What a wonderful Sunday it was!

Since we were commemorating the Day of Pentecost, we had the opportunity to hear the Scripture reading from the Book of Acts which describes how the presence of the Holy Spirit became evident in the midst of a group of initial Christian believers who, long ago, had gathered to worship and pray in Jerusalem. Once the Spirit had arrived, these

A Note about Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (written by Dick Hess, treasurer at Calvary)

As you may know, the new Federal income tax law increases the standard deduction to a level high enough that it does not make sense for some people to continue to itemize deductions. But if you meet certain qualifications, you can still make tax-free contributions to public charities of your choice. You are eligible if you have an IRA and are 701/2 or older. If you fall into this category, you are required to take minimum distributions (RMD's) from your IRA each year. Normally this would be reported as taxable income to you. Simply let the broker-age/bank which manages your IRA know that you would like to make a charitable contribution with a part or all of your RMD. They will ask you to fill out a form with the name of the charity (or church in our case) and the amount you would like to donate. They will cut a check payable to the charity (any 501(c)(3) organization which includes churches) and send it directly to the payee or mail it to you so you can deliver it personally. You must do this each year you wish to make a contribution.

The result is a tax-free charitable contribution whether or not you take the standard deduction. The amount deducted from your annual RMD of charity purposes is not reported as income and will not be included in your adjusted gross income (AGI). This could be a further advantage as AGI is used to calculate certain other taxes and benefits (such as Medicare insurance supplemental premiums). If this is of interest to you, please discuss it with your financial/tax advisor.

FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN:

Working together as the BCM

It's a great group of people I have met with before and I enjoy these meetings. It gives me an opportunity to get to know these people better, especially the ones from the other two churches in the BCM. One of the themes that I took away from that meeting was the overriding desire of the three vestries to do more things together. We were all greatly impressed (as I hope you were as well) with success of the combined service for Pentecost with all three churches and the Bishop's visit and the picnic afterward. As we discussed that day's events, we felt that more things along these lines were important for the continued growth of the collaboration.

For my own part it was great to see our church packed to the rafters with people and what absolutely blew my mind (sorry, I'm a product of the sixties) was how fabulous the combined choirs sounded. Kudos to all the choir members and to Mark Foulsham, as well as Sandra Pierce and Darlene Hobbs for an ambitious and beautiful service full of wonderful music. We sure should have more events like that! I agree.

To that end, we spent a good deal of time discussing the events that we've had this past year and planning which events we were going to carry forward to the coming year. Let me tell you about what we've decided.

These events are mostly Saturday events that celebrate certain times within the church year or examine topics that we feel are important regional and national issues. Below is a summary of events:

The Blessing of the Water—September 8, 2018 at Calvary

A program about water conservation and a short Service followed by a spaghetti dinner at Calvary.

The Blessing of the Animals—October 6, 2018 at Grace

We are inviting our neighbors as well as members from all three churches to come and get their pets blessed.

BCM Bus Trip, most likely on a Saturday tentatively scheduled for **November 10** to the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad Museum, near Cambridge Maryland.

The Choir School Concert of Lessons and Carols—December 21, 2018

This is a chance to hear this beautiful group of voices. It will be at Calvary Church this year and will include a pot luck of light snacks..

Twelfth Night or Epiphany Service—January 5, 2019

This is at Ascension and will include a short Epiphany Service and then a pot luck dinner.

Care of our Environment—April 6, 2019

The idea is to have a combined group work project or clean up to help our environment, along with some fellowship and most assuredly food of some kind.

Also in the time frame of March and April is the **BCM Lenten Program.** Rev. Chris Moore is talking with members of all three churches to pin down the exact dates and times and what topic will be the focus. Last year's topic on the different ages of mankind and how we really aren't that different today from the people in the Bible thousands of years ago was a fascinating, eye-opening discussion on what motivates people at different times in their lives.

Finally Because Pentecost is going to be late in the year in 2019, (early June), we are going to try to get on the Bishop's calendar and host all three churches at Grace again for a **Spring Morning Worship Service and Picnic**.

Planned for Sunday, May 19, 2018. Music, people, good food, burgers, a tent, bouncy house and whatever else we plan. Let's celebrate the end of the year and welcome Bishop Kevin Brown to the BCM once more.

So, as you can see we have a packed schedule of events that we believe will help the members of all three churches to get better acquainted and become more of an active organization, joined together for outreach and worship. I hope you will get involved in one or more of these events. Your help is needed, AND make sure to put these events on your calendar and come to what looks to be a great Season of Creation.
