Pastoral Thoughts from The Rev. Dr. Ketlen Solak

Dear People of Faith,

I would like to invite you to participate along with me in an upcoming community-wide, in-depth Bible study called "Covenant." This video-based course, which is being organized by the Rev. Scott Maxwell, Pastor of St. Mark's Lutheran Church, will be offered throughout the greater Wilmington area from September to April. A number of sessions will be offered on different days, at various times and places. One of these weekly sessions will be offered at Grace Church.

I value this study because of its thematic emphasis on covenant, especially God's Covenant with us and with the whole earth. I also appreciate the way that Pastor Maxwell has structured the study to be both inclusive and ecumenical. This course is aimed at helping participants understand how the concept of covenant unifies the many books of the Bible, and how God is relational and continually acts in love and faithfulness.


Please do consider being a part of what I feel is sure to be a faith-deepening and community-building study. More information will be distributed soon, and the deadline to sign-up is August 31.

Congratulations to our Rector The Rev. Dr. Ketlen Solak





In January of 2014, Calvary Church, Hillcrest, Ascension Church, Claymont, and Grace Church, Wilmington (Talleyville area) entered into a formal covenant to form the Brandywine Collaborative Ministries (BCM). Their covenant was to pursue a shared and collaborative ministry in Brandywine Hundred and beyond, and was to be effective for an initial period of four years. In November of that year, the Rev. Ketlen A. Solak was called to be Covenant Rector for this trial period

Under her leadership and the governance of the BCM Council, consisting of the wardens and two members at large from each church, the BCM has flourished. Now that four years have elapsed, the BCM Covenant has been renewed and is to continue without any term limits as of January 1, 2018.

The BCM Council met at the beginning of June, and, by the unanimous affirmation of all three vestries and BCM Council, the Rev. Ketlen Solak was elected to be the rector of the BCM. With the consent of the Rt. Rev. Bishop Kevin S. Brown and the Standing Committee, the Rev. Solak's rectorship is confirmed. "I am delighted to start this new chapter in the life of the BCM and to continue to be a part of this unique partnership in ministry to which God has called us to give our full and best energy," she said.





FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN:

Volunteerism is alive and well at Grace

I've been reading again. I've been having trouble sleeping lately so I've taken to reading Grace's financial statements, and they are just the thing to make me a little drowsy. A couple of pages and I'm off to dreamland.

Tara Nowak, our bookkeeper looks at them a little more carefully than I do and has pointed out a few things to me that she thinks we should examine because they are solvable problems. Most of our expenses aren't really a surprise, they are the things that we need or use to run the church, office and other programs that happen at Grace throughout the year. However, there are two things that we are spending a significant amount of our budget on. Things that I think we can change to reduce our costs a little.

The first one is heat. Or to be more precise heating oil for our furnaces. One way we can reduce this is to negotiate a better deal on heating oil that we currently have. The Vestry will look into this to see if a better deal is possible, but I'm pretty sure we have done that before and the prices we are paying now for oil ARE the better deal we got from our previous attempts. The other way to reduce heat is to be more careful in how we heat the church buildings. With fall and winter approaching, this is the perfect time to take a careful look at how the thermostats are set and what buildings are set at when they aren't in use, and when and for how long we turn the heat up for different uses such as church services or activities in the parish hall, those kinds of things. We might be able to reduce the amount of oil we use significantly if we are thrifty--and possibly willing to wear a sweater to church during the colder months if we can turn down the thermostat a degree or two when the church is being used. I'll keep you posted on what steps we are taking to reduce our heating costs.

Another big expense is our maintenance and repairs of the church. I first want to say that our Sexton, (the person who takes care of repairs, maintenance and cleaning of the church) Scott Andrews, is a wonderful, generous, capable person whom I consider a gift to our church. He is able to do many things, simple, and not so simple repairs and other chores that we would have to hire an expensive contractor to do, or would go undone. So I am not in any way unhappy with what Scott does for our church. That isn't what this is about. Without him, I'm pretty sure the buildings would have crumbled down around our feet by now.

However there are things that we are paying Scott to do that we could do ourselves. And by ourselves I mean us, the congregation of Grace Church as volunteers. Scott does things like come in and turn up the heat or air conditioning when we want to use part of the church for an event or meeting, Set up tables and chairs, take down tables and chairs, meet with people who are coming to give us estimates for work being done, just be here when someone needs to get into the church for something or let the furnace guys in to do maintenance on our heating system. These are things that take up his time and he charges us for them, as he should. However I think we have gotten lazy. He is performing tasks that Church members performed in the past and we should and could be doing now. I'm sure they are an annoyance to him, and hopefully if we could do them ourselves, would be a savings to the church.

So what I'm asking for is for volunteers. People (probably retired) who could come into church during the day when we need to have someone in to look over a problem, or turn up the heat or air conditioning. Maybe even a "Table and Chair Squad" who would come in after work in the evening and set up chairs for an event the next day or come in after the event and put them away. There are probably many other things that we could do ourselves, I'm sure I've forgotten some that Tara pointed out to me. So please if you think you have some time once in a while to help out around the property. Let me know. Call me or email me at pamiles I@comcast.net or call Joanne at the church office and let her know you would be willing to help. Together we will work out the details of when you are available and what you can and can't do. If we all pitch in and help, we can reduce our costs and keep our financial statements nice and boring. Otherwise I may never get to sleep.

The church purchases the grocery cards at a 5% discount from the grocery stores and then sells them at face value. Grace gets to keep that 5% from each sale.

This is an easy way to contribute to the church by just buying cards to purchase something you need every week – groceries. Diane has cards from Acme, Giant, and Shoprite. The cards are in \$50 and \$100 values.

They work like debit cards, so you do not have to spend them all at one time. So just remember to bring cash or a check on the first and third Sundays of the month and give to the church while you feed your family.
